General Objective

1. To develop a strong composition/developmental writing program for elementary, middle school, and high school students.

Specific Objectives

- 1. Assess deficiencies in the composition/developmental writing program.
- 2. Develop the components of dialogue journal writing for elementary, middle school, and high school students.
- 3. Describe the uses of personal journal writing: getting ideas for topics, importance of demonstrations, taking time for oral sharing, organization and management, student attitudes and learning.
- 4. Teaching techniques on the importance of being a writing model; the vulnerability of writing; teachers, writing together.
- 5. Setting up the classroom environment for writing.
- 6. Learning to write for authentic purposes: relevant wiring, writing letters, writing stories.
- 7. Designing an in-school publishing process.
- 8. Demonstrating techniques for integrating spelling into the Reading-Writing classroom.
- 9. Evaluating the current composition/developmental writing program and designing intervention programs to improve the educational impact on students.

Activities

- 1. Participants will write a list of elements of a good composition and a suggested sequence of writing skills to be taught in a composition program.
- 2. Explore the possibility of implementing writing portfolios across grade levels with a developmental list of writing skills beginning with scribble writing in preschool and moving right into the high research paper.
- 3. Test the current developmental writing program in place in the school to determine if the scope and sequence is adequate for the students.
- 4. Lecture, discussions, demonstrations, peer coaching and team teaching sessions inside the classrooms.
- 5. The instructor will produce and discuss the elements of good compositions; unity, coherence, sequence, transitions, mechanics and usage rules to safeguard meaning.

Evaluation

- 1. The participants will write a comparison of their knowledge teaching writing before and after the workshop.
- 2. Achievement of these objectives will be determined by the participants writing a personal reflection of their own knowledge of the elements of composition and teaching procedures.
- 3. Participants will complete a workshop evaluation form.
