Teaching Students with Disabilities for Physical Education

General Objective

This course provides physical educators information about the foundations of exceptional student education; the provision of services for students with disabilities; and instructional practices that can be used not only for students with disabilities, but with all students.

Specific Objective

- Become familiar with a historical overview of state and federal legislation related to the education of students with disabilities.
- Provide an overview of normal child development, the disability categories identified in state and federal legislation, and disability-specific resources.
- Explore the principles and guidelines of differentiating instruction and Universal Design for Learning that proactively provide an environment aligned to individual learner needs. It also includes examples and resources related to physical education.
