General Objectives

- 1. Train participants in the use of screening techniques to identify students with sensory deficits.
- 2. To be able to develop individual educational plans for the Learning Disabled child in the heterogenous classroom.
- 3. Understand and use in classroom planning in theories of strength modalities in teaching reading; with an emphasis on identifying teaching strategies which will be appropriate to the child's specific deficit.

Specific Objectives

- 1. Demonstrate the use of the audiometer and biopter.
- 2. Identify the behaviors symptomatic of learning disability.
- 3. Discussing and practicing the use of checklists for student referrals.
- 4. Identify problems related to student's ability to receive instruction.
- 5. Identify problems related to student's ability to demonstrate performance.
- 6. Discuss reasonable classroom accommodations.
- 7. Review procedures for referring a student for L.D. screening.
- 8. Setting up in-school procedures for screening and providing individual educational plans for students identified with learning disabilities.
- 9. Identify the strength modality of each student and establish lesson plans which are based on that learning style.
- 10. Enable participants to create an appropriate classroom environment in response to the learning modality of each student.

Activities

- 1. Participants will train in the use of equipment used in screening for sensory deficits.
- 2. Using videotapes and real classroom settings, the instructor will identify students with symptoms of sensory disability.
- 3. The instructor will have the participants use a checklist to identify a potential L.D. child in their school.
- 4. Instructor will assist participants in opening and developing case studies on particular students with an identified L.D.
- 5. Actual classroom visits or demonstration lessons will show how strength modality lessons can be incorporated into the daily lesson plans.
- 6. Assisting participants to think beyond their own strength modality and stretch into learning modality areas which may be foreign to their personal experiences.

Evaluation

- 1. Participants will complete lesson plans and case studies for children with an identified sensory disability.
- 2. Participants will be evaluated by a trained observer or peer coach in a workshop demonstration lesson or actual classroom demonstration lesson.
- 3. Participants will complete a workshop evaluation form.
