General Objectives

- 1. After studying the characteristics of effective schools and quality school research, participants will assess their own school program.
- After assessment, the participants will evaluate the effectiveness of their school program and implement changes to increase learning efficiency.

Specific Objectives

- 1. Identify research characteristics of effective schools.
- 2. Give examples of major premises base on research which support characteristics of effective schools.
- 3. Describe the differences between boss-managed and lead-managed administration styles.
- 4. Write a clear and focused school mission, utilizing group process strategies.
- 5. Develop strategies to insure that the mission statement is reviewed.
- 6. Develop a method to determine whether or not faculty, staff, students, and parents can articulate the school mission.
- 7. Develop a focus on increased student achievement and accomplishment.
- 8. Identify the components of a safe and orderly environment.
- 9. Develop an instrument to determine school climate.
- 10. Develop a school handbook, utilizing group process strategies, which clearly states expectations for student behaviors.

Activities

Independent Research: Development of workshop programs which deal with individual issues of effective schools.

- 1. Specific objectives will be indentified by the activity leader for evaluation by pre and post test or performance measurement.
